a. 2019 Plans & Actions

Strengthen relationships between HWS and the neighborhoods.

i. Off-campus student education – Feb. 2019 (Rhonda Destino)

Ms. Destino provided a recap of the annual off-campus student forum. HWS modified the format based on feedback from the City staff participants from a panel to three workshops. Staff from the Fire Department, Police Department, Communications, and Code helped to facilitate the workshops. Students were split up from their off-campus housemates to rotate through the workshops. A suggestion for next year is to have a property owner represented. Bob volunteered to participate. The three themes were:

1. Being a Good Neighbor: included safety issues, warm weather checks, drunken behavior, history of resident complaints, encouragement to

exchange numbers and meet your neighbors, neighborhood association info, awareness of living in an old house (ex. Photos of how structural beams cannot tolerate large parties).

2. Lease Logistics: Although 90% of students had already signed their lease, the session went over the responsibilities of the landlord and the tenant.
3. HWS & You: The Police Department went over the safety of who is coming to your home, knowing your neighbors and issues they see.

ii. Resident/Student August visits- committee preparation (Sage Gerling)

The committee will join HWS and the Police Department with the off-campus student August (Week of the 26th) visits. We will include knocking on year-round resident doors as well and see if the neighborhood association can join us. HWS has volunteered to have ice cream. For year-round neighbors, we will share info about 911, student and committee info.
